Jim Warner, the author of *Cold Case Christianity*, and a cold case detective said that, “The more I thought I knew, the less teachable I became. My educational self-confidence led to a form of self-reliance in many aspects of my life, including the foundational world view I constructed along the way.” He was an argumentative atheist determined to pick apart anyone who would claim Christianity as the Way to Christ and the way to live as a world view. He has now realized the truth after investigating the facts as he would do any case he was trying to solve. He is now one of the top apologetics speakers because of his method and transformational story. He argues that as soon as students enter college that they have not done the hard work of knowing and growing in their faith enough to defend it when they come against the opposition that many find in college. Jim came to this conclusion after his conversion and having been a youth pastor realized that the majority of his students had abandoned their faith before graduating college. Why? And if you’re a parent that has encouraged them in their faith journey then don’t allow this to convict you. But my regret as a parent is that I didn’t do more to help Brad in his faith journey when I had the chance. But here is my hope and prayers for Abby Brown, Madison Cummings, Allie Downey, Emily Fischels, Emilee Higgs and Cody Jervis. Keep learning and seeking to know the God that created you and gifted you with a unique gift that you and only you can accomplish. Read His word and seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit as you grow in understanding and knowledge. And use whatever avenues it takes to help you learn, whether it be audio, video, small groups or whatever it takes to help you learn. And surround yourself with people who are seeking after God and helping you do the same. Remember the saying, “Show me your friends and I’ll show you your future.” You are going to do what those around you do and that can lead to positive changes in your life or negative ones. Seek times to be quiet and still with God and pray. Be thankful for all He has given you and be honest in how you have left His way, repent and know that He forgives and is seeking to transform you into His image. OF CHARLATANS AND ITCHING EARS

The Charlatan is the person who uses Christianity as a means of personal enrichment, Paul charged Timothy to be on guard against him. "If anyone teaches a different doctrine and does not agree with the sound words of our Lord Jesus Christ and the teaching that accords with godliness, he is puffed up with conceit and understands nothing. He has an unhealthy craving for controversy and for quarrels about words, which produce envy, dissension, slander, evil suspicions, and constant friction among people who are depraved in mind and deprived of the truth, imagining that godliness is a means of gain" (1 Timothy 6:3-5). The Charlatan is only interested in the Christian faith to the extent that it can fill his pocket. He uses his leadership position to benefit from others.

The Tickler is the false teacher who cares nothing for what God wants and everything for what men want. He is the man pleaser rather than the God pleaser. Paul thought him as the ear tick-

ler: "For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching but have itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths" (2 Timothy 4:3-4). The Tickler craves popularity and praise from the world. To maintain his followers' respect, he preaches only the parts of the Bible they deem acceptable. Therefore, he speaks much of happiness but little of sin, much of Heaven, but nothing of Hell. He gives them only what they want to hear. He preaches a partial gospel which is no gospel at all.

Over the past few months I have been listening to preachers who have preached a word and not The Word. They have twisted the truth using Hebrew and Greek words to embellish their story to gain the delight of their audience. They have taken parts of scripture and sculpted them into an account of imaginary or real people and events told for

entertainment. They act as peddlers of custom crafted error who masquerade as teachers of truth. They are charlatans and ticklers who seem like champions but disseminate perversion of the Truth. Their tactics are studied, clever, and effective. They give you a toothy smile and a vacuous content. They preach an empty gospel to a packed house. They toss aside the Bible's content in order to obsess about matters that are trivial or novel. They violate Deuteronomy 4:2 and Revelation 22:18-19.

Where saithe thou this hath occurred? Right in our own backyard. Here in Hopkins County. People are being misled and churches are being disrupted. We must test every spirit to determine if they originate with the Holy Spirit or with a demonic spirit for many false prophets have gone out into the world. Be on guard.
